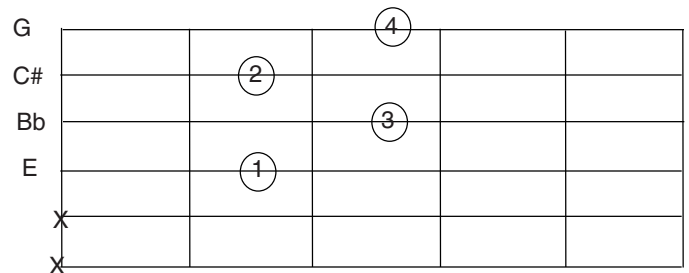


Diminished Chords - Each chord is the diminished chord of all the notes played by that chord

Three positions going up one fret at a time will play diminished chords in all keys, and then the pattern starts over on the next fret

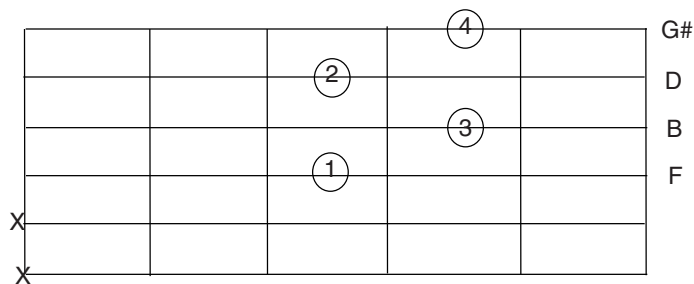
