
Shoo Fly, Don't Bother Me

This comic song, from the minstrel stage, was written by Billy Reeves and Frank Campbell, and published 1869. It soon became a popular play party, and remains a well-known song for kids today. In the original lyrics, the last line of the first part was "I belong to Company G." Company G was one of the black regiments that fought for the Union in the Civil War.
